WORK PLAN:

Applicants should be able to demonstrate familiarity with Syntax of Indigenous Languages, theoretical linguistics and typological theories. They should also conduct research with description, revitalization and documentation of under-represented languages, with particular focus on native languages spoken in Brazil and in Mozambique.

Applicants should demonstrate the ability to deal with the methodology of working with language consultants, i.e., native speakers from these countries interested in engaging in the project by providing acceptability judgments about their language. The research on syntax will be based on data collected using a variety of methodologies including one-on-one elicitations, elicitation of narratives, naturally occurring speech, and other forms of current use of colloquial style.

The selected candidate will contribute to the improvement of the activities carried out at the Graduate Program in Linguistic Studies - POSLIN/FALE and help graduate and undergraduate students on the linguistic activities to be carried out in this project, such as (a) tape-recording of oral narratives, transcription and translation with the aid of bilingual speakers; (b) grammatical analysis of the texts and description of their morphological and syntactic features; (c) collection of data from elicitation sessions (one-on-one) so as to test hypotheses and analyze specific issues concerning the grammar of the languages to be investigated.

The work plan, proposed for a period of one year (August, 2019 to July, 2020) for Brazilian Visiting Professor and two years (August, 2019 to July, 2021) for Foreign Visiting Professor, must include teaching activities such as courses in the graduate program, which may be opened to students from undergraduate courses, supervision of undergraduate and graduate students, research activities (publishing of articles and books, participation in scientific events etc.).

SCORE: 150 points

PERIOD: One year (August, 2019 to July, 2020) for Brazilian Visiting Professor and two years (August, 2019 to July, 2021) for Foreign Visiting Professor.

FINAL SCORE: Sum of the points of the curriculum (150) and the research proposal (150), divided by 2.
